MARY THE HOLY MOTHER OF GOD

January 1 is the oldest celebration of Mary in the Catholic Church. The custom of honoring the Virgin on the first day of the New Year originates in the sixth century, when her celebration was tied to the octave day of Christmas, the eighth day after December 25. In doing so, ancient preachers would remind their congregations about the role that Mary played in the history of salvation. Jesus was born of a woman, and so, as Eucharistic Prayer 4 states, "Made incarnate by the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary, he shared our human nature in all things but sin." The human nature of Christ is rooted in his being born like us. As we round out the Christmas celebration with its Octave Day on January 1, we venerate the woman who gave birth to him.

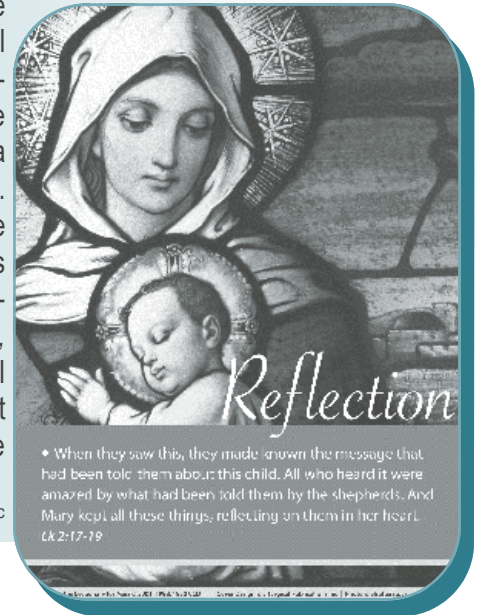
There is a dual action in today's Gospel that is sometimes overlooked. The shepherds find the infant in the manger as has been told to them by the angel. And then they go out to tell others about the child. In the meantime, Mary reflects on all these things in her heart. These are the two complementary stances of the Christian: action and reflection. Both are needed for a balanced spiritual life. It is, in effect, putting into practice

the two great commandments: love God and love your neighbor.

As we begin the New Year, it is customary to make resolutions: to diet, to exercise, to change something in one's life. Like Mary, who reflected on the events surrounding the birth of her child, we take some time to reflect on our own lives: where we have been, and where we are going. The Gospel gives us the opportunity to situate that reflection in a spiritual context.

What does the birth of Jesus mean for me spiritually (*reflection*), and what do I intend to do about that in my daily life (*action*)?

ad limina

Approximately every five years, the bishops of each region gather for a visit to the Holy Father at the Vatican. The purpose of the visit – called the *ad limina* visit – is to give an account of their dioceses to the Holy See. Archbishop Vigneron and his auxiliary bishops, along with other bishops from Michigan and Ohio, are to make their *ad limina* visit from February 1-6, 2012. Through the means of social media, Archbishop Vigneron is inviting our communities to join him on a “virtual pilgrimage” for this historic occasion.



Between now and early February, Catholics may join in offering a Spiritual Bouquet for Pope Benedict XVI. Spiritual Bouquets are prayers, devotional acts, or good deeds that someone offers for someone else. This can be the number of Masses attended, Holy Communion offered, rosaries and/or other prayers said, or good deeds performed. One of the best parts of this ministry is that it can be done communally or alone, at church, at school, or at home. On behalf of the entire Archdiocese, Archbishop Vigneron will personally present to the Holy Father the Spiritual Bouquet in the form of a listing of all the spiritual offerings given for his intentions.



During the Christmas season, Archbishop Vigneron will launch a website for the pilgrimage. At that point, and throughout the month of January, you can let Archbishop Vigneron know through this site, by email/fax, or through social media – what you have offered to be included as part of the Spiritual Bouquet to be given to Pope Benedict XVI. The website also will contain messages from Archbishop Vigneron and the auxiliary bishops, information about our local Church, and more interesting history about the *ad limina* visit.

The term *ad limina* comes from the Latin Phrase “ad limina apostolorum,” which means “to the thresholds of the apostles.” During their *ad limina* visit, the bishops will visit the tombs of two great apostles – Saints Peter and Paul. This pilgrimage connects the bishops, and our local Church, to the Catholic Church throughout history, and throughout the world. We look forward to sharing this pilgrimage with him, and offering our many good acts, prayers and devotions to the Vicar of Christ. More specific details will be forthcoming.

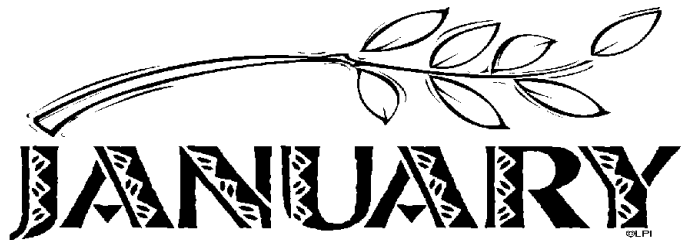

In St. Luke's Gospel, shepherds find Mary, Joseph, and the infant Jesus in a stable in Bethlehem. The shepherds understand what they have been told — that Mary, the Mother of God, has given birth to Jesus, the Word made flesh. Mary becomes the first disciple of Christ, along with Joseph. St. Paul teaches that through Jesus, the Son of God, born of Mary, we become children of God. Stewardship begins with accepting discipleship in the Lord. Do we follow Mary's example of fully trusting in God's call and doing His will in our lives?

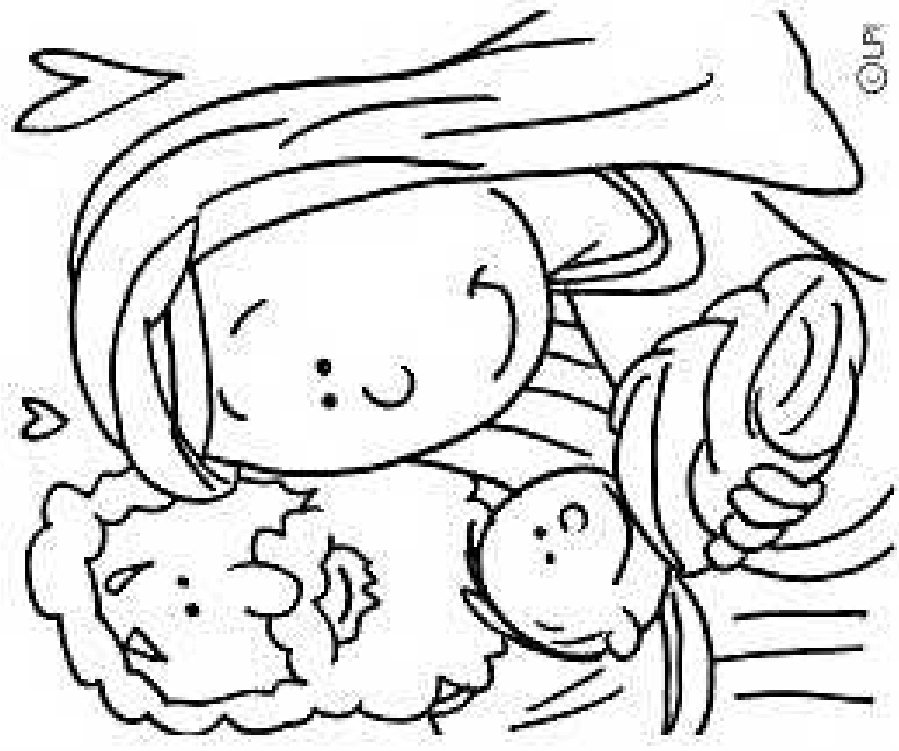

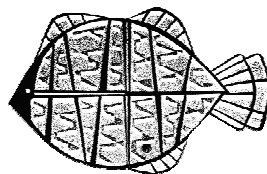
